This side event will present university modules that have been prepared within the framework of the Education for Justice (E4J) initiative to discuss their design and development process, as well as their use and application at the tertiary level by academic institutions.

COUNTER-TERRORISM UNIVERSITY MODULE SERIES

- 14 modules focusing on a variety of counter-terrorism topics
- Each module contains a "Possible Class Structure", which includes in-class exercises, student assessment, learning objectives and teaching slides
- Accompanied by a Teaching Guide, detailing the innovative exercises suggested in each module
- The modules also contain extensive reading lists and links to various teaching tools - useful for exploring topics in further depth
- Currently being translated into other languages (e.g. Chinese, Russian, Spanish)

TRAFFICKING IN FIREARMS UNIVERSITY MODULE SERIES

The E4J initiative is developing the University Module Series on Firearms, recognizing the fundamental role of firearms in criminal and security contexts. The modules are intended to support lecturers teaching on firearms to provide students with the opportunity to better understand the scale of the illicit firearms phenomenon and its connections with crime, in particular with organized crime, terrorism and insurgency. The lecturers will have the opportunity to use the modules in parts or in their entirety. This modular approach allows lecturers to develop new courses or to simply adapt and include the information contained in these modules into already existing teaching curricula.
